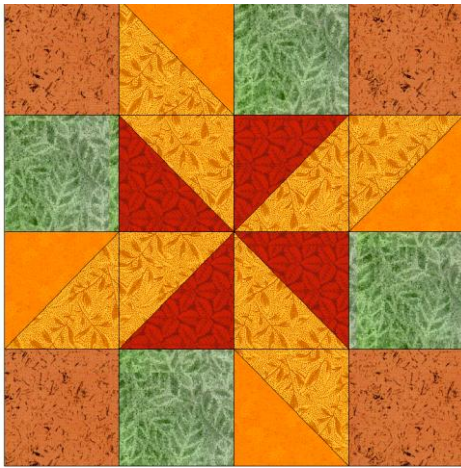










# Autumn Splendor Table Runner



## Clay's Choice

### 16" Block Variation

This is a perfect item to use some of your fat quarter stash !

Fabric key	Number of patches	Yardage estimate	Fabric key	Number of patches	Yardage estimate
	Border	1 + 1/2		C 32	2 FQ or 3/8
	A 16	1 FQ or 1/4		D 16	1 FQ or 1/4
	B 16	1 FQ or 1/4		E 16	1 FQ or 1/4

### Cutting your Fabric :

Fabric A: Cut 16 – 4 1/2" squares

Fabric E : Cut 16 – 4 1/2: squares

You have a choice on cutting for your Half Triangles

For Quarter Triangles using 10" square

Fabric B & C : cut 2 – 10" squares each

Fabric C & D : cut 2 – 10" squares each

For Quarter Triangles using single fabric strips

Fabric B & C : cut 2 strips 5 1/2" x 22"

Fabric C & D : cut 2 strips 5 1/2" x 22"

For the border: you will determine the amount to cut

after you have measured the length of the completed block project.

The finished block length should be around 65" on the sides and 21" on the top and bottom

# Half-Square Triangles

( using 10" cut squares )

Place Fabric B & C - 10 inch squares right sides together

Mark a line in the center of the block top to bottom and side to side

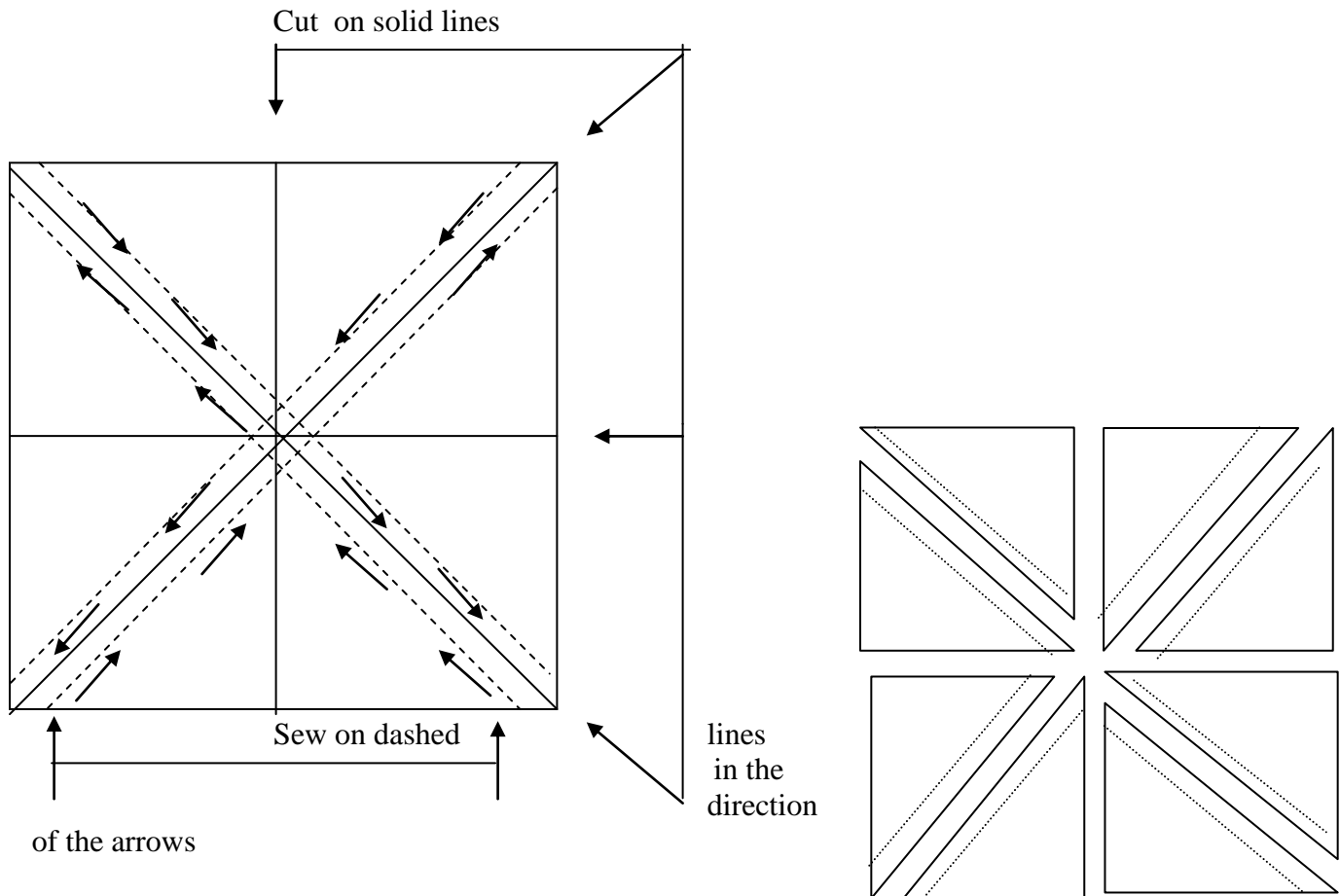
*(note: using either freezer paper or half"-square tissue paper will make the project easier)*

Sew on the dashed lines  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the center solid lines

Cut apart on the solid lines

Open each unit and press seam to the darker fabric

Square -up to make each unit  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares



Each 10" block will give you 8 half-square triangle blocks  
 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square when opened and squared-up

# Half –Square Triangles

( using cut strips )

Place Fabric B & C - cut strip 5 ½” x 22” right sides together

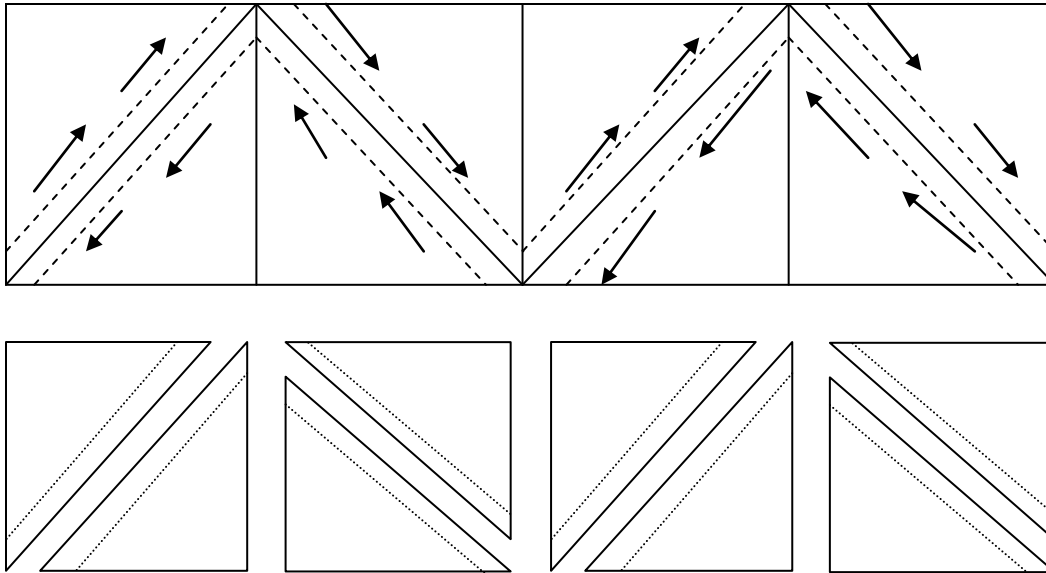
Mark vertical lines every 5 ½” for 4 blocks per strip

Sew on the dashed lines ¼” from the center solid lines

Cut apart on the solid lines

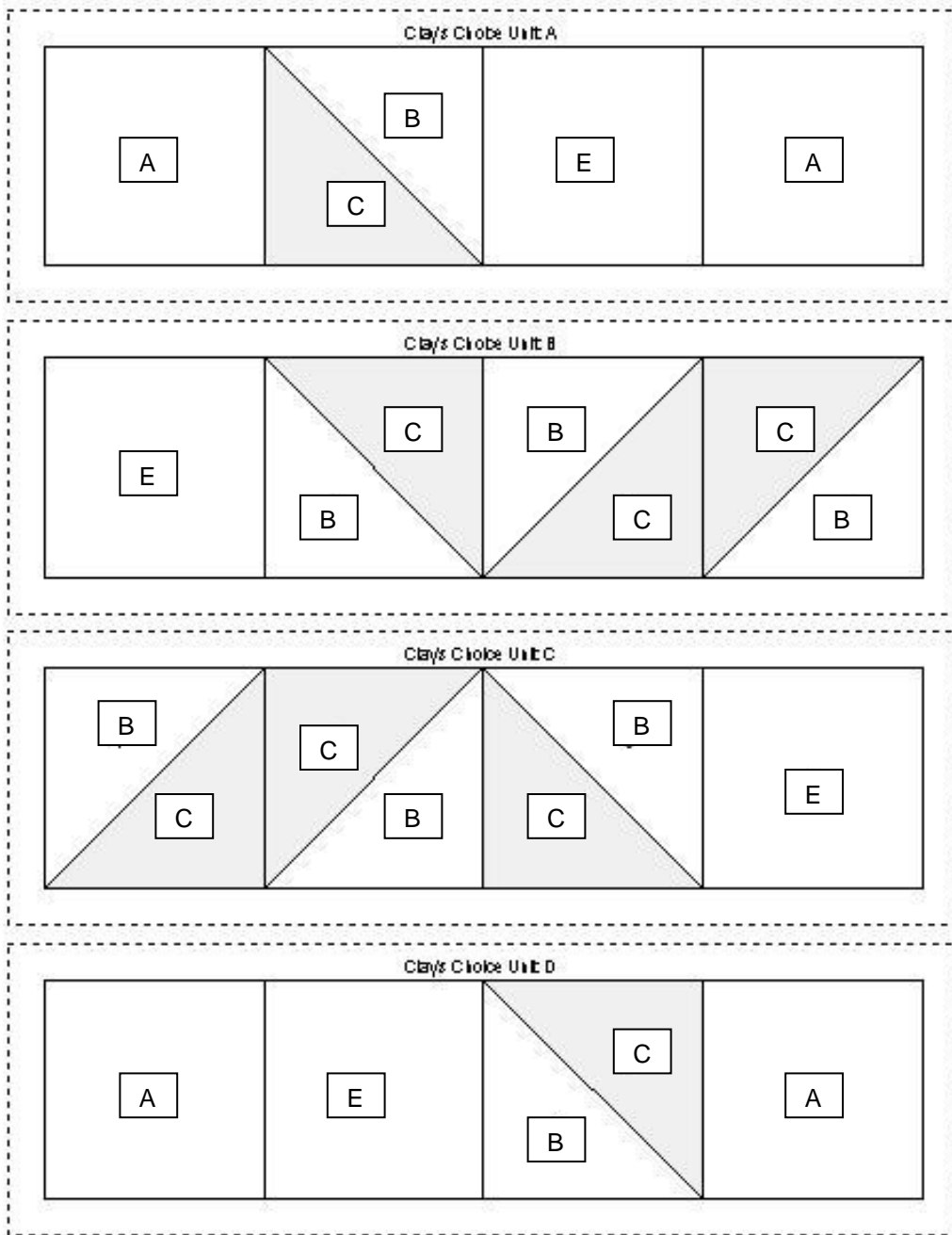
Open each unit and press seam to the darker fabric

Square –up to make each unit 4 ½” squares



Each strip will give you 8 half-square triangle blocks  
4 ½” square when opened and squared-up

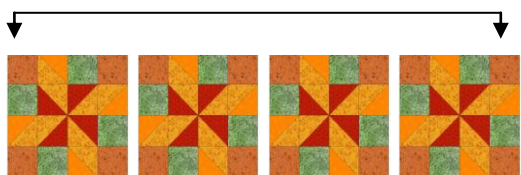
Using the diagram below, begin assembling your blocks in horizontal rows.  
 Then sew your rows together to complete your block.  
 Square –up your blocks to measure 16 ½ “.



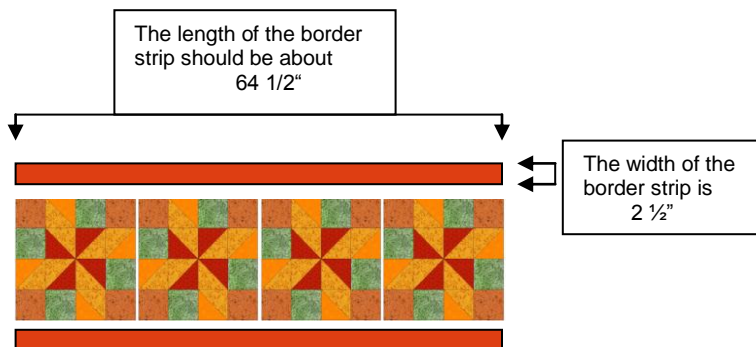
Once you have all 4 of your blocks done, sew the blocks together in a single horizontal row.

Your row should measure about

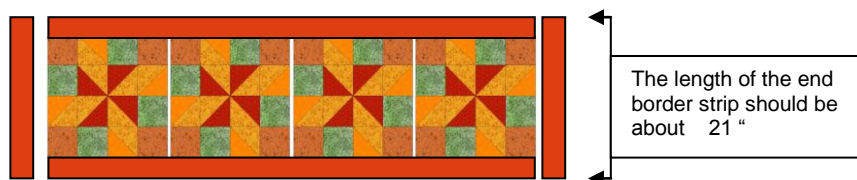
64 1/2"



Measure the length of your completed block row and cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide of your border fabric by the length of the completed block strip and sew onto each side.



Then measure the top and bottom width of your project and cut two strips of the border fabric 2 1/2" by the width and sew onto the top and bottom of the end blocks..



Cut your backing and batting the same size as your top.

Place the right side of the top to the right side of your backing.

Place the batting against the backing fabric.

Pin together and sew around the project leaving an opening for turning.

Once sewn, clip the corners close so there will not be any excess bulk.

Turn inside out through the opening.

Lightly press.

Hand-sew the opening closed with a blind stitch.

You can now make the choice to either hand quilt, machine quilt or 'tie' your table runner.
